Mrs. Novak moved to approve a Special Use Permit for a fitness-training establishment in the CR Zoning District for the property known as 6200 Daytona Drive, with the following conditions:

- 1. The Special Use Permit shall expire with the discontinuance of the business, change in business ownership, or change in property ownership.
- 2. The Special Use Permit shall be revoked with verified complaints from adjacent businesses or property owners.
- 3. Customer parking shall only be permitted in the parking lot for this facility, and parking directly in front of the building is not permitted. Two no parking signs shall be placed in front of the building.
- 4. Customer parking shall not be permitted in adjacent parking lots, or other private property.
- 5. The business shall not open the doors during classes. Music or audio related to the business shall not project outside of the building onto adjacent properties.

He added that fences have the capacity to adversely impact the flow of water from the natural grade established for a parcel. The intent is to keep fences out of the drainage easement to prevent any adverse consequences that may arise as a result of the installation.

Grace Galvan, 1044 Tuneberg Parkway, Belvidere, IL was sworn in as Objector. Mrs. Galvan indicated that they own property adjacent to the proposed billboards. She expressed concerns with home value and the ability to sell or rent the home with the new billboards.

Gerald Artz, 5921 Park Ridge Road, Loves Park, IL was sworn in as objector. Mr. Artz expressed concerns regarding privacy, traffic, and too much lighting in a residential area.

Walter Reed, 6453 Harlem Road, Loves Park, IL was sworn in Objector. Mr. Reed who owns Casey's Auto Center expressed concerns regarding Safety, traffic, lighting and the visibility of his business sign. He also stated that the property has not been taken care of properly over the years.

Mr. Hickey stated that new digital lighting would be directed in manner to not affect the residential neighbors.

Mr. Quintanilla stated that since 2005, 200 traffic incidents have occurred in that area, which were not caused by billboard light, but due to the heavy traffic.

Mr. Becker stated that a smaller sign, higher in height, and a new sidewalks are positive things, however; changing light and exposure to residential are negative.

Mrs. Toohill that she feels the billboard would take away from other businesses in an already tight area.

Mr. Becker moved to deny a Special Use Permit for a billboard sign over 600 sq. ft. in the CR Zoning District for #11-01-405-007 and #11-01-405-008 E. Riverside Blvd. Second by Mrs. Toohill. The findings of the facts have not been met but discussed in accordance with the zoning recommendations provided.

ORDINANCE NO.	
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AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF A CLASS "B" LIQUOR LICENSE TO COSTCO WHOLESALE CORPORATION d/b/a "COSTCO WHOLESALE #1353" PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 6, SECTION 6-37 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, Chapter 6, Sections 6-37 and 6-43 of the Loves Park Code of Ordinances ("Code") of the City of Loves Park ("City") regulate the number and classes of liquor licenses, respectively, existing within the City; and

WHEREAS, a Class "B" liquor license authorizes the retail sale of packaged alcoholic liquor but not for consumption on the premises where sold; and

WHEREAS, the City now desires to approve the issuance of a Class "B" liquor license to Costco Wholesale Corporation, doing business as "Costco Wholesale #1353" ("Licensee"), pursuant to Chapter 6, Section 6-37 of the Code; and

WHEREAS, said liquor license shall be issued for use only within that part of the building located at 5000 Stadium Drive, Loves Park, Illinois, 61111; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, WINNEBAGO COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The above recitals are incorporated by reference herein and made a part hereof.
- 2. The issuance of a Class "B" liquor license to the Licensee for use at the Premises is hereby approved pursuant to Chapter 6, Section 6-37 of the Code.
- 3. Final issuance of the liquor license by the local liquor commissioner will be subject to review and approval of the liquor license application by the local liquor commissioner along with compliance by Licensee with all Ordinances of the City of Loves Park and all applicable State and/or Federal laws.
- 4. All other provisions of the Code and any City Ordinances or Resolutions shall remain in effect as previously enacted except that those Ordinances, Resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

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ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PLACING OF STOP SIGNS TO CREATE A FOUR-WAY STOP AT THE INTERSECTION OF EAST DRIVE AND CLIFFORD AVENUE IN THE CITY OF LOVES PARK

WHEREAS, the installation of stop signs to effect a four-way traffic stop has been requested at the intersection of Clifford Avenue and East Drive; and

WHEREAS, currently a stop sign is in effect on both Eastbound and Westbound Clifford Avenue at East Drive; and

WHEREAS, Fehr-Graham & Associates, as the City Engineer, review the request to establish a four-way stop at this intersection and found that it DOES NOT meet warrants for such,

WHEREAS, based on the review submitted by the City Engineer and hereby attached to this Ordinance, the Director of Community Development and Public Works recommends denial of the request to establish a four-way stop at the intersection of Clifford Avenue and East Drive,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, ILLINOIS:

- 1. The City of Loves Park does hereby establish traffic stop signs at the following locations:
 - a. Northbound lane of East Drive at Clifford Avenue.
 - b. Southbound lane of East Drive at Clifford Avenue.
- 2. All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict area hereby repealed.
- 3. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

Re: East Drive and Clifford Avenue - Multi-Way STOP Analysis

Dear Mr. Thompson,

Fehr Graham has been retained by the City of Loves Park to review the intersection of East Drive and Clifford Avenue with respect to the proposed traffic control devices that are being considered. More specifically, the proposed modification of the current stop control for the minor street to a four-way stop condition. Both streets are two-lane, two-way roadways with parking allowed on both sides of East Drive and on the north side of Clifford Avenue. East Drive is considered the major roadway and does not have any traffic control, while Clifford Avenue is the minor roadway and has STOP sign traffic control. The conditions at the subject intersection were compared to the criteria listed in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) Multi-Way Stop Applications (Section 2B.07).

The MUTCD criteria for multi-way STOP sign installations are as follows:

- A. Where traffic control signals are justified, the multi-way stop is an interim measure that can be installed quickly to control traffic while arrangements are being made for the installation of the traffic control signal.
- B. Five or more reported crashes in a 12-month period that are susceptible to correction by a multi-way stop installation. Such crashes include right-turn and left-turn collisions as well as right-angle collisions.
- C. Minimum volumes:
 - 1. The vehicular volume entering the intersection from the major street approaches (total of both approaches) averages at least 300 vehicles per hour for any 8 hours of an average day; and
 - 2. The combined vehicular, pedestrian, and bicycle volume entering the intersection from the minor street approaches (total of both approaches) averages at least 200 units per hour for the same 8 hours, with an average delay to minor-street vehicular traffic of at least 30 seconds per vehicle during the highest hour; but
 - 3. If the 85th-percentile approach speed of the major-street traffic exceeds 40 mph, the minimum vehicular volume warrants are 70 percent of the values provided in Items 1 and 2.
- D. Where no single criterion is satisfied, but where Criteria B, C.1, and C.2 are all satisfied to 80 percent of the minimum values. Criterion C.3 is excluded from this condition.

Traffic signals warrants for the MUTCD criterion A were not analyzed but based on engineering judgment. The warrants for signals should not be warranted since several of the STOP sign criteria are the same as the warrants for traffic signals. There are only two (2) crash reports for the intersection within a 12-month period, so this does not meet the MUTCD criterion B of 5 crashes in 12-months. The peak hour of traffic on East Drive is 237 vehicles per hour (vph) based on ten (10) percent of the Illinois Department of Transportation's Annual Average Daily Traffic projected to the year 2019 at 0.5 percent. The 237 vph during the peak hour does not exceed 300 vph required for the major roadway according to MUTCD criterion C.1 and will not meet or exceed 300 vph for any 8 hours of the average day. No data was available for Clifford Avenue for vehicles, however, as Clifford is the minor street, it is assumed that the vph is less than what was reported for East Drive. Based on the information provided by the Steve Thompson of the City of Loves Park, pedestrians and bicycle traffic in this area is minimal and would fall below the MUTCD requirements. This position seems to be substantiated by the field conditions which indicate an incomplete sidewalk system. These observations suggest that the subject intersection would not satisfy MUTCD criterion C.2; however, the data is incomplete at this time. A speed study was performed by the City of Loves Park on East Drive. The 85th percentile speed based on this study is 32 miles per hour (mph), which does not exceed 40 mph for MUTCD criterion C.3.

As noted above, MUTCD criterion D, allows for criteria B, C.1, and C.2 to be reduced to 80 percent of the measure listed in each criterion. The reduced value for MUTCD criterion B is 4 crashes in a 12-month period, and for MUTCD criterion C.1 is 240 vph for any 8 hours of an average day. These criteria are still not met at the subject intersection with the reduced minimum values. As state previously, MUTCD criterion C.2 cannot be fully analyzed since there was no available data.

Our review of the data provided regarding the intersection of East Drive and Clifford Avenue indicates a multi-way STOP is not warranted based on the MUTCD criteria for a multi-way STOP sign installation.
