RELEVANT FACTS:

The applicant would like to develop this parcel for a fast food restaurant with a drive-thru window, and for a multi-tenant retail building. The drive-thru requires a special use permit.

The project is required to provide a site obscured dumpster enclosure. The site plan shows that both buildings will be providing a site obscured enclosure. The requirement is satisfied.

The proposed development is required to provide landscaping on the perimeter and interior of the parking area, and along frontages. The landscaping proposed meets the landscaping requirement. In the past, some developments have allowed landscaping to fall by the way side, by not maintaining it. The business or landowner or land owner should be accountable for continuous maintenance for landscaping approved as part of the special use.

The required parking for both uses is 63 parking stalls. The site plan shows that 64 parking stall will be provided. The parking requirement, including ADA stalls, is satisfied.

Signage is included on the site plan, however, the site plan does not provide details about setbacks or type of sign to be installed. The signage for this special use shall comply with the current City standards for new signs.

Recommendation:

Approval - A Special Use Permit for a drive-thru window in the CR(Commercial Retail) and E. Riverside Boulevard / I90 Overlay District.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, BOONE AND WINNEBAGO COUNTIES, ILLINOIS IMPOSING A MUNICIPAL CANNABIS RETAILERS' OCCUPATION TAX

WHEREAS, the City of Loves Park has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that protect the public health, safety and welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax Law, 65 ILCS 5/11-8-22 *et seq*. ("Act"); and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is intended to impose the tax authorized by the Act providing for a municipal cannabis retailers' occupation tax which will be collected by the Illinois Department of Revenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Loves Park as follows:

SECTION 1. Recitals. The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. Adoption of Tax. Chapter 82 of the Municipal Code of the City of Loves Park shall be amended by the creation of Article VIII that will read as follows:

ARTICLE VIII Municipal Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax.

Sec. 82-151. Municipal Cannabis Tax imposed.

- **1. Rate** (a) A tax is hereby imposed upon all persons engaged in the business of selling cannabis, other than cannabis purchased under the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Pilot Program Act, at retail in the City at the rate of three percent (3%) of the gross receipts from these sales made in the course of that business.
- (b) The imposition of this tax is in accordance with the provisions of Sections 8-11-22, of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-11-22).

2. Collection of tax by retailers.

(a) The tax imposed by this Ordinance shall be remitted by such retailer to the Illinois Department of Revenue ("Department"). Any tax required to be collected pursuant to or as authorized by this Ordinance and any such tax collected by such retailer and required to be remitted to the Department shall constitute a debt owed by the retailer to the State. Retailers may reimburse themselves for their seller's tax liability hereunder by separately

stating that tax as an additional charge, which charge may be stated in combination, in a single amount, with any State tax that sellers are required to collect.

- (b) The taxes hereby imposed, and all civil penalties that may be assessed as an incident thereto, shall be collected and enforced by the Department. The Department shall have full power to administer and enforce the provisions of this article.
- **3. Severability.** If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application of any provision of this Ordinance, is held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such occurrence shall not affect other provisions of this Ordinance, or their application, that can be given effect without the unconstitutional or invalid provision or its application. Each unconstitutional or invalid provision, or application of such provision, is severable, unless otherwise provided by this Ordinance.
- **Sec. 82-152 Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law, provided, however, that the tax provided for herein shall take effect for all sales on and after the first day of January 2020. Copies of this Ordinance shall be certified and sent to the Illinois Department of Revenue prior to September 30, 2019.

SECTION 3. The City clerk is hereby directed to send a certified copy of this Ordinance immediately upon its passage to the Illinois Department of Revenue.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
