1. The well diameter will be 12" to better accommodate our equipment and tooling.

2. The well will be constructed by the dual rotary drilling method (Barber) utilizing a Foremost DR24HD drill rig. The temporary 12" steel well casing will be advanced to total well depth (190 feet). A temporary 12" telescoping screen with k-packer will be installed inside the 12" casing and the 12" casing will be pulled back to expose the screen to the native formation. The well will then be developed, test pumped and sampled. The 12" screen and casing will then be removed and the well properly abandoned with grout and/or bentonite chips. Screen design to be determined based on drill cuttings.

# AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING EXCHANGE OF CITY-OWNED REAL ESTATE AT 4096 INTERSTATE BOULEVARD, LOVES PARK, ILLINOIS WITH REAL ESTATE HELD BY INTERSTATE BOULEVARD PROPERTIES LLC ALONG AND NORTH OF STARWOOD DRIVE, LOVES PARK, ILLINOIS

**WHEREAS**, the City is a duly organized and existing municipality created by the laws of the State of Illinois and is operating pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code as amended from time to time; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 76.2 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-76.2-1 *et seq.*) permits the City to exchange land when doing so is deemed by the City to be in its best interests; and

WHEREAS, the City believes it is in its best interest for the furtherance of economic development, a public purpose, to exchange property it owns, commonly known as 4096 Interstate Boulevard, Loves Park in Winnebago County, Illinois having PIN Number 12-01-151-016 consisting of approximately 0.57 acres ("Interstate Property") with property owned by Interstate Boulevard Property LLC that does not have an assigned numerical address but which is located along the north side of a portion of Starwood Drive lying west of Interstate Boulevard having PIN number 12-01-151-014 consisting of approximately 0.18 acres ("Starwood Drive Property"), with both the Interstate Property and Starwood Drive Property depicted in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and legally described in Exhibit "B" attached hereto; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 76.2 of the Illinois Municipal Code the corporate authorities of the City were required to hold a Public Hearing before such exchange of land could take place; and

**WHEREAS,** at a meeting held October 28, 2019, the Loves Park corporate authorities did unanimously pass a resolution to hold the required Public Hearing on November 25, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. at the Loves Park City Hall; and

**WHEREAS,** the City caused to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City a public notice of the required Public Hearing with such publication occurring on November 7, 2019, a date not less than fifteen (15) days before the Public Hearing nor more than thirty days (30) prior to the date of the Public Hearing; and

**WHEREAS**, the Public Hearing was held on November 25, 2019 at the meeting that began at 6:00 p.m. at the City Hall; and,

**WHEREAS,** the City believes it is in its best interests to exchange its Interstate Property with the Starwood Drive Property as the exchange better positions the properties to promote further economic development and growth of the tax base of the City; and

**WHEREAS,** as a result of the exchange the City satisfies a condition of a Sales Tax Revenue Sharing Agreement entered into by the City dated December 12, 2018 and will be able to avoid making a payment of \$200,000 which would otherwise be due pursuant to that Sales Tax Revenue Sharing Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, the corporate authorities of the City find that the premises to be conveyed by the municipality under such exchange is no longer needed by the municipality for the public interest; and

**WHEREAS,** the corporate authorities of the City find that the premises to be received by the municipality under such exchange will prove useful to the municipality and will be for the public interest; and

**WHEREAS**, the corporate authorities of the City find that, in consideration of the long-term best interest of the public, the total value of the substitutional premises is approximately equal to or exceeds the value of the premises for which same are being exchanged.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** by the City Council of the City of Loves Park, Illinois, that:

- 1. The above recitals are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance as if fully stated herein.
- 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to sign all ordinary and customary documents and take other related action to consummate the exchange contemplated herein.
- 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court or competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions thereof.
- 4. All other provisions of the Code and any City Ordinances or Resolutions shall remain in effect as previously enacted except that those Ordinances, Resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

## ORDINANCE NO.

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, WINNEBAGO AND BOONE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS TO PROHIBIT ADULT-USE CANNABIS BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS

**WHEREAS**, the City has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs and that protect the public health, safety and welfare of its citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, this Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of the Illinois Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, Public Act 101-0027, which provides that the City has the authority to prohibit adult-use cannabis business establishments; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has determined that the operation of cannabis business establishments would present adverse impacts upon the health, safety and welfare of the residents, and additional costs, burdens and impacts upon law enforcement and regulatory operations of the City of Loves Park; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that passage of this ordinance prohibiting the location of adult use cannabis business establishments within the City is in the best interests of the City and the public; and

**WHEREAS**, nothing herein shall be deemed to conflict with or in any way impede or impact the provisions set forth in the Municipal Code of the City of Loves Park ("City Code") pertaining to Medical Cannabis, including but not limited to Medical Cannabis Cultivation Centers and Medical Cannabis Dispensing Organizations.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Loves Park, Winnebago and Boone Counties, Illinois as follows:

**SECTION 1. Recitals.** The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 2.** Adult-Use Cannabis Business Establishments Prohibited. Chapter 22 of the City Code shall be amended by the addition of Article VII that will read as follows:

### ARTICLE VII Adult-Use Cannabis Business Establishments Prohibited.

### Sec. 22-310. Definitions.

The following words and phrases shall, for the purposes of this Article VII, have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by this section, as follows:

Adult-Use Cannabis Business Establishment: A cultivation center, craft grower, processing organization, infuser organization, dispensing organization or transporting organization.

Adult-Use Cannabis Craft Grower: A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to cultivate, dry, cure and package cannabis and perform other necessary activities to make cannabis available for sale at a dispensing organization or use at a processing organization, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A.101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-Use Cannabis Cultivation Center: A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to cultivate, process, transport and perform necessary activities to provide cannabis and cannabis-infused products to licensed cannabis business establishments, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A.101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder. Adult Use Cannabis Cultivation Center does not include Medical Cannabis Cultivation Centers as defined in Section 102-9 of the City Code.

Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organization: A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation to acquire cannabis from licensed cannabis business establishments for the purpose of selling or dispensing cannabis, cannabis-infused products, cannabis seeds, paraphernalia or related supplies to purchasers or to qualified registered medical cannabis patients and caregivers, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A.101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder. Adult Use Cannabis Dispensing Center does not include Medical Cannabis Dispensing Centers (Medical Cannabis Dispensary) as defined in Section 102-9 City Code.

Adult-Use Cannabis Infuser Organization Or Infuser: A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to directly incorporate cannabis or cannabis concentrate into a product formulation to produce a cannabis-infused product, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A.101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-Use Cannabis Processing Organization Or Processor: A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to either extract constituent chemicals or compounds to produce cannabis concentrate or incorporate cannabis or cannabis concentrate into a product formulation to produce a cannabis product, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A.101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-Use Cannabis Transporting Organization Or Transporter: An organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to transport cannabis on behalf of a cannabis business establishment or a community college licensed under the Community College Cannabis Vocational Training Pilot Program, per the Cannabis

Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A.101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

*Person*: A natural individual, firm, corporation, limited liability company, partnership, association, joint stock company, joint venture, club, society or other organization, including any owner, manager, proprietor, employee, volunteer or agent, or a receiver, executor, trustee, guardian, or other representative appointed by Order of any court.

**Sec. 22-311. Adult-Use Cannabis Business Establishments Prohibited.** The following Adult-Use Cannabis Business Establishments are prohibited in the City of Loves Park. No person shall locate, operate, own, suffer, allow to be operated or aide, abet or assist in the operation within the City of Loves Park of any of the following:

Adult-Use Cannabis Craft Grower

Adult-Use Cannabis Cultivation Center

Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organization

Adult-Use Cannabis Infuser Organization or Infuser

Adult-Use Cannabis Processing Organization or Processor

Adult-Use Cannabis Transporting Organization or Transporter

Adult-Use Cannabis Business Establishments do not include Medical Cannabis Cultivation Centers or Medical Cannabis Dispensing Organizations (Medical Cannabis Dispensaries) as set forth in Section 102-9 of the City Code.

**Sec. 22-312. Public Nuisance Declared.** Operation of any prohibited Adult-Use Cannabis Business Establishment within the City of Loves Park in violation of the provisions of this Article VII is hereby declared a public nuisance and shall be abated pursuant to all available remedies.

**Sec. 22-313. Violations.** Violations of this Article VII may be enforced in accordance with the provisions of Section 54-217 of the City Code.

**SECTION 3. Penalties.** Section 54-217 of the City Code shall be amended to include a violation of new Section 22-313 by inserting the highlighted language below. As amended, Section 54-217(a) shall read as follows:

Sec. 54-217. – Maintaining public nuisance.

(a) *Generally*. Any building or dwelling used in the commission of offenses prohibited by sections 720 ILCS 5/9-1, 5/10-2, 5/11-14, 5/11-15, 5/11-16, 5/11-17, 5/11-20.1, 5/11-21, 5/11-22, 5/12-5.1, 5/16-1, 5/20-2, 5/24-1(a)(7), 5/24-3, 5/28-1 or 5/31-5, prohibited by the Illinois Controlled Substances Act (720 ILCS 570/1 et seq.), or the Cannabis Control Act, or used in the commission of an inchoate offense relative to any of the aforesaid principal offenses, or used to engage in gang-related activities within the meaning of section 54-216, or used in violation of section 22-313 of this Code, is a public nuisance.

**SECTION 4. Conflicts.** Any ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict with this ordinance, other than those ordinances drafted pursuant to and in compliance with the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Pilot Program Act, 410 ILCS 130/1 *et seq.*, are hereby expressly repealed.

**SECTION 5. Severability.** If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application of any provision of this Ordinance, is held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such occurrence shall not affect other provisions of this Ordinance, or their application, that can be given effect without the unconstitutional or invalid provision or its application. Each unconstitutional or invalid provision, or application of such provision, is severable, unless otherwise provided by this Ordinance.

**SECTION 6. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.
