WHEREAS, Tenant is now known as USCOC of Illinois, LLC, an Illinois limited liability company; and

WHEREAS, the City and Tenant have entered into three (3) amendments to the Lease since 2001 including the First Amendment to Water Tower and Ground Space Lease dated September 30th, 2002; the Second Amendment to Water Tower and Ground Space Lease dated September 3rd, 2008; and the Third Amendment to Water Tower and Ground Space Lease dated April 5th, 2012; and WHEREAS, the City and Tenant have negotiated terms for a Fourth Amendment to the Water Tower and Ground Space Lease ("Fourth Amendment") which raises the number of antennas from nine (9) to twelve (12) with cables and radio equipment associated therewith and increases the monthly rent by Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00); and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to authorize the Mayor to enter into the Fourth Amendment on behalf of the City.

FOURTH AMENDMENT TO WATER TOWER AND GROUND SPACE LEASE

This Fourth Amendment to Water Tower and Ground Space Lease ("Fourth Amendment"), made this _______day of _______, 2020, modifies that certain Water Tower and Ground Space Lease dated October 29, 2001, as amended by the First Amendment to Water Tower and Ground Space Lease dated September 30th, 2002, as amended by the Second Amendment to Water Tower and Ground Space Lease dated September 3rd, 2008, as amended by the Third Amendment to Water Tower and Ground Space Lease dated April 5th, 2012 (collectively the "Lease") by and between City of Loves Park, having an address at 100 Heart Boulevard, Loves Park, Illinois 61111 ("Landlord") and USCOC of Central Illinois, LLC, an Illinois limited liability company, having an address at Attention: Real Estate Lease Administration, 8410 West Bryn Mawr Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, 60631 ("Tenant").

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Lease, Landlord has leased to Tenant certain premises located at 7925 Harlem Road ("Tank #3"), Loves Park, Illinois 61111 (the "Premises") for use as a telecommunications site; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to amend the Lease to document Tenant's increase of the number of antennas located at said Premises from nine (9) to twelve (12) and the cabling and radio equipment upgrades associated therewith ("Tenant Upgrades"); and

WHERAS, the Tenant has performed a structural analysis report to confirm the sufficiency of the structure integrity of the water tower upon which Tenant's property will be placed; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to memorialize increased rent payment terms in exchange for Landlord's assent to the Tenant Upgrades at the Premises.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms of the Water Tower and Ground Space Lease and this Fourth Amendment and for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Landlord and Tenant agree as follows:

- 1. Landlord consents to the Tenant's Upgrades at the Premises.
- 2. Section 2(d) of the Lease shall be amended to read "an antennae pod at the top of the water tower with twelve antennae and coax cables for the use of telecommunication"
- 3. Exhibit B of the Lease is hereby deleted and replaced with Exhibit B-1 herein.
- 4. Starting January 1, 2021 the Rent the Tenant pays to the Landlord will increase by Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per month.

5. The Lease, pursuant to Section 5, automatically renews every five (5) years on its anniversary with the next such renewal to occur in October 2021. Subsequent rent increases occur upon renewals and will be determined pursuant to the formula set forth in Section 8 of the Lease with the increase based upon the then-current rent which shall be inclusive of the rent increase referenced in this Fourth Amendment.

- 6. In addition to and not by way of limitation of Tenant's existing obligations, representations, warranties and duties to Landlord, Tenant further represents and warrants that the Tenant's improvements will not damage or impair the structural integrity of the water tower or exceed the structural limitations of the tower considering all uses to which the tower is put by Landlord and its collective tenants and from the presence of all existing equipment thereon regardless of the ownership thereof, and Tenant agrees that it shall be solely responsible for any repairs occasioned by or occurring as a result of its use pursuant to the Lease and all amendments thereto.
- 7. In all other respects the Lease is hereby ratified and affirmed without change.





WHEREAS, the City desires to amend certain portions of Chapter 102 - Zoning, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing before the Zoning Board of Appeals was held thereon after due notice in the manner provided by law, and

WHEREAS, said Board has made a report recommending the approval of the Text Amendment, and

WHEREAS, the City of Loves Park is authorized and empowered by the Statute to adopt and enforce the provisions of this ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Text Amendment of the Loves Park Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Add. Chapter 102, Article I, In General, Section 102-9, Definitions, as follows:

Adult-use cannabis business establishment means a cultivation center, craft grower, processing organization, infuser organization, dispensing organization or transporting organization.

Adult-use cannabis dispensing organization means a facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation to acquire cannabis from licensed cannabis business establishments for the purpose of selling or dispensing cannabis, cannabis-infused products, cannabis seeds, paraphernalia or related supplies to purchasers or to qualified registered medical cannabis patients and caregivers, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A.101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder. Adult use cannabis dispensing center does not include medical cannabis dispensing centers (medical cannabis dispensary) as defined.

Adult-use cannabis infuser organization or infuser means a facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to directly incorporate cannabis or cannabis concentrate into a product formulation to produce a cannabis-infused product, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act,

(P.A.101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-use cannabis processing organization or processor means a facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to either extract constituent chemicals or compounds to produce cannabis concentrate or incorporate cannabis or cannabis concentrate into a product formulation to produce a cannabis product, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. I 01-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-use cannabis transporting organization or transporter means an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to transport cannabis on behalf of a cannabis business establishment or a community college licensed under the Community College Cannabis Vocational Training Pilot Program, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A.101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

All other provisions of Chapter 102-9 Definitions shall remain in effect as previously published.

Add. Chapter 102, Article III, Division 3, Commercial, Section 102-174, CR Retail Commercial District, (c), Special uses, (21), as follows:

- (21). Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organization: The proposed facility must comply with the following:
- a. The facility may not be located within 1000 linear feet of the property line of a pre-existing public or private nursery school, preschool, primary or secondary school, day care center, day care home or residential care home. Learning centers and vocational/trade centers shall not be classified as a public or private school for purposes of this Section. Measurement shall be from property line to facility building.
- b. Facility may not be located in a dwelling unit or within 250 linear feet of the property line of a pre-existing property with Residential zoning.

 Measurement shall be from residential property line to facility building
- c. At least 75% of the floor area of any tenant space occupied by a dispensing organization shall be devoted to the activities of the dispensing organization as authorized by the Act, and no dispensing organization shall also sell food for consumption on the premises.
- d. Facility may not conduct any sales or distribution of cannabis other than as authorized by the Illinois Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. 101-0027).
- e. Facility shall be prohibited from on-site consumption of cannabis or cannabis infused food items.
- f. For purposes of determining required parking, Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organization, shall refer to Chapter 102, Article V, Off-Street Parking and Loading, however, the City may require that additional parking be provided as a result of the analysis of proposed site and facility location.

- g. Facility may not be located within a distance of 1 mile (5280 linear feet) of an existing Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organization. Measurement shall be from building to building.
- h. Facility may not be located with 500 linear feet of any existing public park facility. Measurement shall be from park property line to facility building.

All other provisions of Chapter 102 - Zoning, Article III, Division 3 –Commercial, shall remain in effect as previously published.

Amend. Chapter 102, Article III, Division 4, Industrial, Section 102-188, IL Light Industrial District, (b), Permitted uses, (14), as follows

- (14) Adult-use cannabis craft grower and cultivation center: The proposed facility must comply with the following:
- a. Facility building may not be located within 200 feet of the property line of a preexisting public or private nursery school, pre-school, primary or secondary school, day care center, day care home or residential care home. Learning centers and vocational/trade centers shall not be classified as a public or private school for purposes of this section. Measurement shall be from property line to facility building.
- b. Facility may not be located within 200 feet of the property line of a preexisting property with Residential zoning. Measurement shall be from residential property line to facility building.
- c. Facility may not conduct any sales or distribution of cannabis other than as authorized by the Illinois Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. 101-0027).
- d. For purposes of determining required parking, adult-use cannabis craft grower shall refer to <u>chapter 102</u>, article V, Off-Street Park and Loading, however, the city may require that additional parking be provided as a result of the analysis of proposed site and facility location.
- Facility shall be required to provide internal and external video surveillance and security system that saves footage of the past 24 hours for a minimum of seven days.

Add. Chapter 102, Article III, Division 4, Industrial, Section 102-188, IL Light Industrial District, (b), Permitted uses, (15), as follows:

- 15. Adult-Use Cannabis Infuser or Processing/Processor Organization: The proposed facility must comply with the following:
- a. Facility may not be located within 500 linear feet of the property line of a preexisting public or private nursery school, preschool, primary or secondary school, day care center, day care home or residential care home. Learning centers and vocational/trade centers shall not be classified as a public or private school for purposes of this Section. Measurement shall be from property line to facility building.
- b. Facility may not be located in a dwelling unit or within 250 linear feet of the property line of a pre-existing property with Residential zoning. Measurement shall be from residential property line to facility building.

- c. At least 75% of the floor area of any tenant space occupied by an infusing organization shall be devoted to the activities of the infusing organization as authorized by the Act. Facility may not conduct any sales or distribution of cannabis other than as authorized by the Illinois Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. 101-0027).
- d. For purposes of determining required parking, Adult-Use Cannabis Infuser Organization, shall refer to Chapter 102, Article V, Off-Street Parking and Loading, however, the City may require that additional parking be provided as a result of the analysis of proposed site and facility location.

Add. Chapter 102, Article III, Division 4, Industrial, Section 102-188, (b), Permitted uses, (16), as follows:

- 16. Adult-Use Cannabis Transporting Organization: The proposed facility must comply with the following:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Text Amendment of the Loves Park Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Add. Chapter 102, Article I, In General, Section 102-9, Definitions, as follows:

Home occupation means an occupation, profession, activity or use located in a residential districts, and which use is merely incidental to the residential use and does not change the character of the neighborhood by externally detectable lighting, noise, odor, or appearance associated with the activity, and is created and operated as a sole proprietorship with no more than one non-residential employee.

All other provisions of Chapter 102 - Zoning, Article I, In General, Section 102-9, shall remain in effect as previously published.

The recommendation of the Zoning Board of Appeals on the question of granting this Text Amendment is hereby accepted, adopted and made a part of this Ordinance. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
