Additionally, a landscape bed shall be provided around the parking area on the eastern part of the development. It shall mirror the landscaping being provided on the Forest Hills Road frontage. The mixed tree variety and additional landscape bed shall be approved and coordinated with staff. The owner will be responsible for the maintenance, repair and replacement of all landscaping materials. The plant materials and landscaping bed areas shall be tended and maintained in a healthy growing condition and free from refuse, debris and weeds at all times.
- 3. The dumpster area shall be obscured with landscaping.
- 4. The sign for the establishment shall meet the requirements established in Article VI, Section 102-284. The parking provided for this establishment shall be sufficient.
