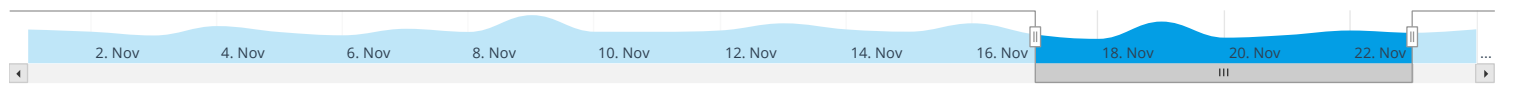
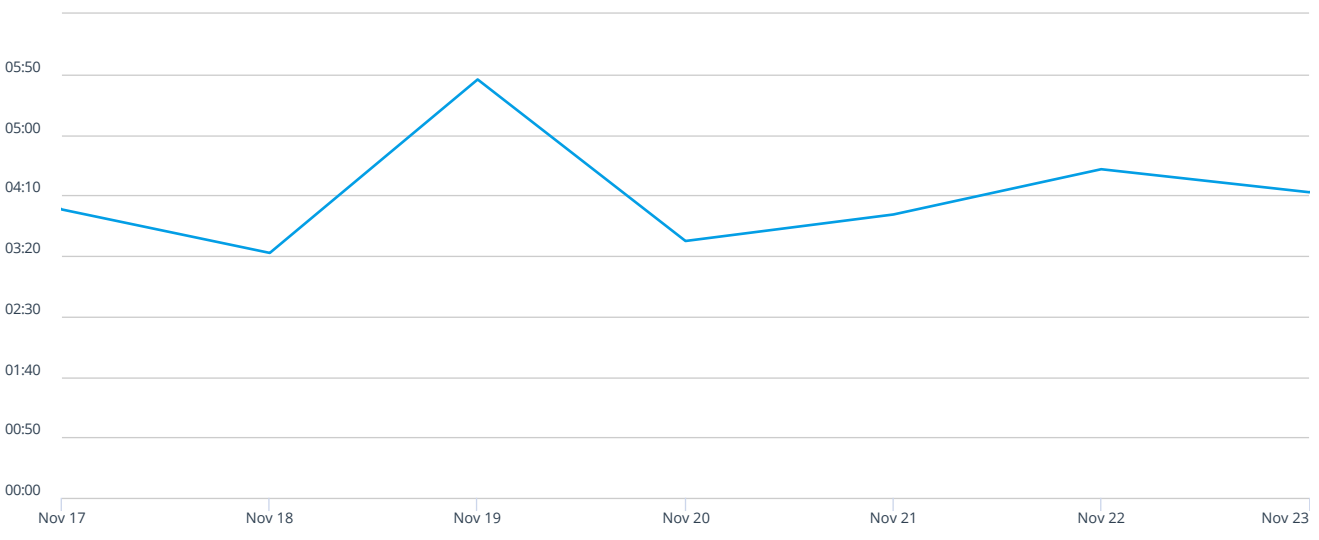

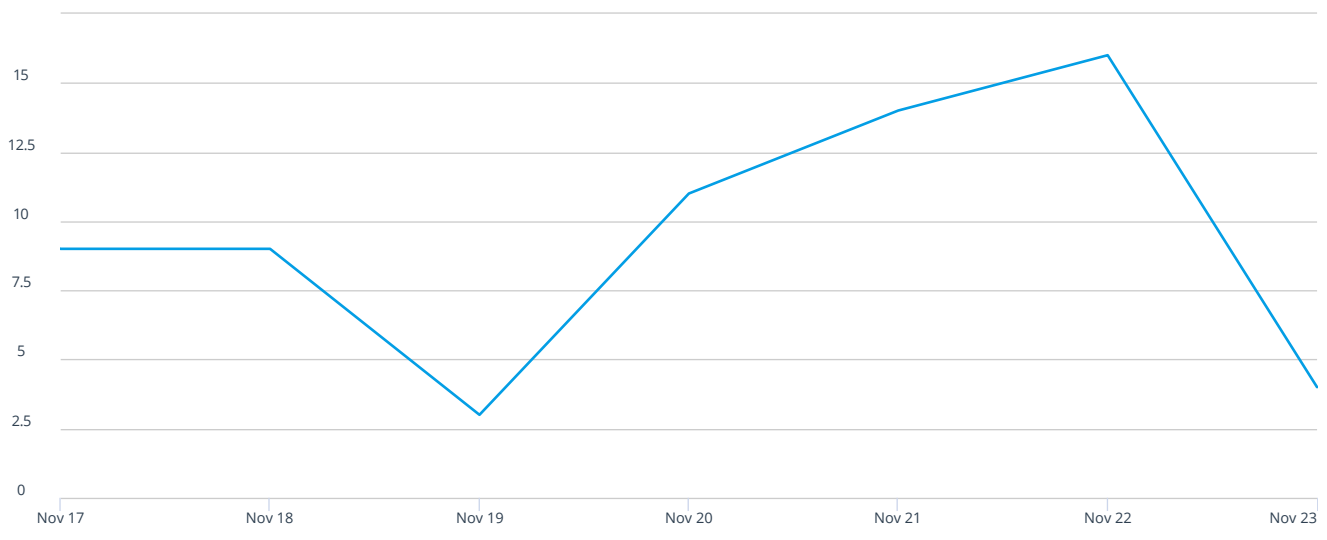

**B. 5105 N. Second Street** – A Variance to widen the driveway 12 feet across the front of the home in the CR (Commercial Retail) Zoning District.

**Staff Recommendation:** Approval

**Condition(s):**

1. No recreational vehicles, boats, or trailers shall be allowed to be parked on the pad, and all passenger vehicles shall be in good running order and non commercial.

**C. 1034 Windsor Road (08-31-454-011 & 08-31-454-010) – A Special Use Permit for a duplex in the CR (Commercial Retail) Zoning District.**

**Staff Recommendation: Approval w/ conditions**

1. The Special Use Permit expires with the discontinuance of Windsor Pizza Parlor, or sale of the properties 08-31-454-011 or 08-31-454-010.
2. The entire parking lot shall be curbed.
3. The 2 (4ft in depth) landscape berms are sufficient to meet the requirement. The landscaping shall include replacement of all Gold Coast Juniper bushes with Karl Forester Grasses. Landscaping shall also include replacement of all Dwarf Lilac shrubs with ornamental Bradford Pear Trees. And, replacement of the Dwarf Crabapple Tree with a Shademaster Honey Locust Tree. The landscape hedge, on the western property line for parcel 08-31-454-010, shall continue southward to the 30 foot setback for the property. Islands in and around the parking lot shall contain some combination of perennials and may be coordinated with Staff. If staff recommendations for this condition are met, the landscaping for both uses shall be sufficient for this development. An updated landscape plan shall be provided within 30 days of approval of the special use.
4. Eighteen feet deep stalls will be adequate for meeting the stall requirement in order to observe vehicle circulation.
5. Restaurant parking shall only be allowed in the newly created parking lot designated for its customers. A private parking sign shall be installed to accommodate the residents living in the duplexes.

**ORDINANCE NO.**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 86 OF ARTICLE VI OF THE LOVES PARK CITY CODE TO ADD SEC. 86-153 REGULATING THE PASSAGE OF PEDESTRIANS ON PUBLIC ROADWAYS TO PROMOTE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY AND THE FREE FLOW OF TRAFFIC IN THE COMMUNITY.**

**WHEREFORE**, pedestrian presence for extended periods along and within the public thoroughfare or on the median dividing lanes of traffic outside of designated crosswalks, presents significant public health, welfare, and safety concerns particularly when occurring in traffic lanes of public ways at intersections with high traffic volumes and high accident histories and particularly at public ways containing multiple lanes; and

**WHEREFORE**, the City has a substantial government interest in protecting the safety of motorists and pedestrians as well as promoting the free flow of traffic along public thoroughfares and therefore does not allow for pedestrian traffic in other than designated crosswalks or at the intersection if crosswalks are not marked; and

**WHEREFORE**, by its very nature, pedestrian presence on public ways distracts drivers from ordinary safe traffic movements in travel lanes on public ways; and

**WHEREFORE**, drivers and others using those regulated public ways should not be exposed to the distractions of pedestrians walking up and down travel lanes or medians outside of pedestrian crosswalks even when vehicles are temporarily stopped for a traffic control device at an intersection; and

**WHEREFORE**, the safety of pedestrians is at significant risk when present in public ways meant for the use of and control of vehicular traffic and not designed or regulated for pedestrian movements up and down lanes of travel; and

**WHEREFORE**, distractions in lanes of travel from whatever source, impede the free flow of traffic and result in the delay or obstruction of the public's free flow of travel and increases the possibility of accidents as well as injury to pedestrians and to drivers alike; and

**WHEREFORE**, it is the purpose and the intent of this Ordinance to provide reasonable regulation for public safety directing that pedestrians must conduct their activities on public sidewalks or in designated crosswalks outside of the flow of traffic for the safety of themselves and passing motorists; and

**WHEREFORE**, the City currently has ordinances in place that provide that obstructing or encroaching upon public highways, private ways, streets and alleys is a public nuisance (54-187) and that no person shall stand or loiter in a street or roadway other than in a safety zone (86-151); and

**WHEREFORE**, State law provides that pedestrians shall not cross a roadway at any place other than a marked crosswalk (625 ILCS 5/11-1003); and



**WHEREFORE**, the extended presence of pedestrians in the median or traffic lanes of the City represents a danger to the health and safety of pedestrians and motorists alike.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, WINNEBAGO COUNTY AND BOONE COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1) The above recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance as though fully set forth herein.
- 2) Chapter 86 of Article VI of the Loves Park City Code is hereby amended to add Sec. 86-153 – Traversing Roadways by pedestrians, reading as follows:

**SEC. 86-153. – Traversing roadways by pedestrians.**

In order to promote public safety and particularly the safety of drivers and pedestrians on City roadways, all pedestrians must enter the roadway solely at marked crosswalks and remain in such crosswalks while traversing the roadway for only such time as would be reasonable to progress from one side of the street to the other.

- (a) In the event that there is not a marked crosswalk, after assessing traffic flow, all pedestrians shall cross at the intersection at the point where a crosswalk would typically be located, in a manner and direction so as to take the shortest route traversing the roadway and shall make due progress to complete crossing within a reasonable time.
  - (b) Crossing or entering the roadway at other than the intersection is prohibited as is the crossing of an intersection diagonally.
  - (c) It is prohibited to loiter in the crosswalk or on the median or to use either for other than the orderly crossing of the thoroughfare for the purpose of traversing from one side to the other.
  - (d) It is also prohibited to walk in the designated driving lanes whether or not traffic is flowing at the time.
  - (e) In emergency situations, pedestrians may use the shoulder to traverse and exit the roadway by the shortest route possible, but only if there is not a sidewalk present.
- 3) If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court or competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions thereof.
  - 4) All other provisions of the Code and any City Ordinances or Resolutions shall remain in effect as previously enacted except that those Ordinances, Resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

5) This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

**AN ORDINANCE ABATING THE TAX HERETOFORE LEVIED FOR THE YEAR 2021 TO PAY PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON \$4,100,000.00 GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING ALTERNATE BONDS (MOTOR FUEL TAXES ALTERNATE REVENUE SOURCE), SERIES 2017, OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, WINNEBAGO AND BOONE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, the City Council (the “*Council*”) of the City of Loves Park, Winnebago and Boone Counties, Illinois (the “*City*”), by ordinance adopted on the 17th day of April, 2017 (the “*Ordinance*”), did provide for the issuance of \$4,100,000.00 General Obligation Refunding Alternate Bonds (Motor Fuel Taxes Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2017, dated October 17, 2017 (the “*Bonds*”), and the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay principal and interest on the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the City has Pledged Revenues (as defined in the Ordinance) available for the purpose of paying principal and interest on the Bonds heretofore imposed by the 2021 levy; and

**ORDINANCE NO.**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 86 OF ARTICLE VI OF THE LOVES PARK CITY CODE TO ADD SEC. 86-153 REGULATING THE PASSAGE OF PEDESTRIANS ON PUBLIC ROADWAYS TO PROMOTE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY AND THE FREE FLOW OF TRAFFIC IN THE COMMUNITY.**

**WHEREFORE**, pedestrian presence for extended periods along and within the public thoroughfare or on the median dividing lanes of traffic outside of designated crosswalks, presents significant public health, welfare, and safety concerns particularly when occurring in traffic lanes of public ways at intersections with high traffic volumes and high accident histories and particularly at public ways containing multiple lanes; and

**WHEREFORE**, the City has a substantial government interest in protecting the safety of motorists and pedestrians as well as promoting the free flow of traffic along public thoroughfares and therefore does not allow for pedestrian traffic in other than designated crosswalks or at the intersection if crosswalks are not marked; and

**WHEREFORE**, by its very nature, pedestrian presence on public ways distracts drivers from ordinary safe traffic movements in travel lanes on public ways; and

**WHEREFORE**, drivers and others using those regulated public ways should not be exposed to the distractions of pedestrians walking up and down travel lanes or medians outside of pedestrian crosswalks even when vehicles are temporarily stopped for a traffic control device at an intersection; and

**WHEREFORE**, the safety of pedestrians is at significant risk when present in public ways meant for the use of and control of vehicular traffic and not designed or regulated for pedestrian movements up and down lanes of travel; and

**WHEREFORE**, distractions in lanes of travel from whatever source, impede the free flow of traffic and result in the delay or obstruction of the public's free flow of travel and increases the possibility of accidents as well as injury to pedestrians and to drivers alike; and

**WHEREFORE**, it is the purpose and the intent of this Ordinance to provide reasonable regulation for public safety directing that pedestrians must conduct their activities on public sidewalks or in designated crosswalks outside of the flow of traffic for the safety of themselves and passing motorists; and

**WHEREFORE**, the City currently has ordinances in place that provide that obstructing or encroaching upon public highways, private ways, streets and alleys is a public nuisance (54-187) and that no person shall stand or loiter in a street or roadway other than in a safety zone (86-151); and

**WHEREFORE**, State law provides that pedestrians shall not cross a roadway at any place other than a marked crosswalk (625 ILCS 5/11-1003); and

**WHEREFORE**, the extended presence of pedestrians in the median or traffic lanes of the City represents a danger to the health and safety of pedestrians and motorists alike.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, WINNEBAGO COUNTY AND BOONE COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1) The above recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance as though fully set forth herein.
- 2) Chapter 86 of Article VI of the Loves Park City Code is hereby amended to add Sec. 86-153 – Traversing Roadways by pedestrians, reading as follows:

**SEC. 86-153. – Traversing roadways by pedestrians.**

In order to promote public safety and particularly the safety of drivers and pedestrians on City roadways, all pedestrians must enter the roadway solely at marked crosswalks and remain in such crosswalks while traversing the roadway for only such time as would be reasonable to progress from one side of the street to the other.

- (a) In the event that there is not a marked crosswalk, after assessing traffic flow, all pedestrians shall cross at the intersection at the point where a crosswalk would typically be located, in a manner and direction so as to take the shortest route traversing the roadway and shall make due progress to complete crossing within a reasonable time.
  - (b) Crossing or entering the roadway at other than the intersection is prohibited as is the crossing of an intersection diagonally.
  - (c) It is prohibited to loiter in the crosswalk or on the median or to use either for other than the orderly crossing of the thoroughfare for the purpose of traversing from one side to the other.
  - (d) It is also prohibited to walk in the designated driving lanes whether or not traffic is flowing at the time.
  - (e) In emergency situations, pedestrians may use the shoulder to traverse and exit the roadway by the shortest route possible, but only if there is not a sidewalk present.
- 3) If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court or competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions thereof.
  - 4) All other provisions of the Code and any City Ordinances or Resolutions shall remain in effect as previously enacted except that those Ordinances, Resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.



5) This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING NO PARKING ON THE NORTH SIDE OF A PORTION OF RIVER LANE IN THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, ILLINOIS**

**WHEREAS, River Lane is a Public roadway within the limits of the City of Loves Park, Illinois;**

**NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOVES PARK, ILLINOIS:**

**SECTION 1:** That a No Parking zone be established on River Lane in the City, Illinois, as follows:

- (a) That no parking shall be established on the North side of River Lane between North Second Street (IL251) and Walker Avenue
- (b) That the No Parking area identified in (a) above has been determined to be necessary for the public safety and well-being of the residents and motorists of the City of Loves Park, Illinois.

**SECTION 2:** That the appropriate No Parking signs shall be erected to reflect the Ordinance.

**SECTION 3:** This Ordinance is to become effective upon its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form or in any other form as provided for by law.

**SECTION 4:** That the Code of Ordinance of the City of Loves Park, Illinois shall be amended to include the provisions of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 5:** This Ordinance repeals and amends the terms of any and all previous and/or existing Ordinance in conflict with the provisions contained herein.

**SECTION 6:** That the City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form or in any other form as provided for by law.
